
As a result of a settlement in a class action lawsuit, M.K.B. v. Eggleston, the NYC Human Resources Administration (HRA) agreed to review the denial or discontinuance of public assistance (Temporary Assistance, Medicaid and/or Food Stamps) for certain non-citizens who have been battered or subjected to extreme cruelty by someone in their household. A new issue code has been designated for M.K.B.-related issues.

Requests to review the above determinations of eligibility for public assistance are hearable and should be coded as follows:

Agency: N080  
Action: DEN, DISC, INAD  
Category: FA or SNA  
Subcategory: None  
Issue code: **109 (219, 453)**
