A new Fair Hearing Information System (FHIS) edit became available on June 15, 2008 that alerts Communications Intake Unit (CIU) staff of the potential need to add <u>Varshavsky</u>-related protections to certain fair hearing requests, as appropriate. This edit will effect all requests Statewide involving Issue Codes 211, 241, 246, and 260 as follows:

- 211 MANAGED LONG TERM CARE
- 241 LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE (LPN) AND/OR REGISTERED NURSE (RN)
- 246 PERSONAL CARE/HOME CARE SERVICES/HOUSEKEEPING
- SERVICES/Lombardi (LTHHC)
- 260 CERTIFIED HOME HEALTH AIDE

When processing requests containing these issue codes, if CIU staff do not enter the NYS6 designation in the Agency field or Issue Code 997 (VARSHAVSKY LITIGATION) or Issue Code 999 (HOME HEARING REQUESTED), a message will appear at the bottom of the screen which asks the following:

"Is Varshavsky protection required? See FHIS 900 codes or enter N to continue"

After review, if staff determine <u>Varshavsky</u>-related protection is warranted, they enter the NYS6 and 997/999 and transmit, or they have to enter "N" (for no) to continue. It is essential that CIU staff note in the Comments the reason for adding the <u>Varshavsky</u> protection, i.e. the reason the appellant is unable to travel to attend a fair hearing at the regular hearing site or the reason <u>Varshavsky</u> protection was not given.
